Service

The College has a commitment to share knowledge and to assist those in need. Education assists social mobility and widens horizons. It is an unending journey best undertaken with others.

Each student is encouraged to take part in service activities whether through the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme or through other school activities such as St Vincent de Paul, Amnesty International, Civil Defence or supporting the foodbank.

The school has one of the most extensive Duke of Edinburgh Award Schemes in New Zealand with a co-ordinator who oversees service activities and outdoor education pursuits.

Academic Programme

Sacred Heart College is an academic school with excellent results in all public examinations. Our staff has been active in the development of the National Certificate of Educational Achievement and our achievement levels are available for parents to see.

Students in consultation with their parents and the teachers decide what subjects they would like to study.

Sacred Heart College has high expectations that students will achieve at their full potential. The College offers a wide range of subjects in the following fields: Art, Commerce, Digital Technology, Drama, English, Mathematics, Music, Physical Education, Science, Social Sciences and Technology.

We also offer the Sacred Heart College Sports Academy. This academy has been established to identify and work with high-performing students who we believe have the potential to become elite competitors during their time at Sacred Heart College.

Technology

Sacred Heart College has a high ratio of computers to students.

There is ongoing training for staff and a strategic plan for IT which ensures regular updates of hardware. Students contribute to the website and have run an online student newspaper.

The College has a technology suite, which offers excellent facilities for design, graphics, and design technology.

A variety of media is used, including soft materials, metal, wood and plastics. Students working in this department have won the Institute of Professional Engineers of New Zealand Award with functional toys and furniture for children.

Soft materials are also a feature with wearable arts competitions being entered.

Independent research is a focus across the curriculum and is supported by excellent library resources, and ready access to computers enables students to access information from around the world.

Leadership

Leadership opportunities abound at Sacred Heart College. There are six houses – Siena, Aubert, Lourdes, Lisieux, Avila and Barbier, each of which has a House Captain and two House Leaders.

There is a Head Girl, Deputy Head Girl and a Student Representative on the Board of Trustees. All Year 13

students are encouraged to assume a leadership role through peer support and the form class structure.

An active School Council pursues fundraising goals for each year, and strong leadership in sports teams and cultural clubs provides development opportunities for students.

This is a democratic body decided by annual student elections. It has 21 members.

There is a peer support programme. Year 13 students apply and after an acceptance process they are given training. These girls assist all our Year 9 students.



Pastoral Care

This is a community of kindness and good care. We have an excellent Dean/Guidance structure which supports students, and a peer support system where students help and assist one another.

International fee paying and exchange students have a manager who is responsible for their pastoral care both at school and in their homestays. Homestay parents are valued members of the school community and are fully involved in their adoptive daughters' schooling.
