Nau mai, haere mai, e te whānau,

On Saturday, as a church community, we celebrated the Feast of the Visitation—a moment of profound grace and courage. This feast commemorates the journey of Mary, a young woman newly pregnant and likely overwhelmed, who travelled to visit her older cousin Elizabeth. Despite her fears, Mary was met not with judgment, but with unconditional love and joyful recognition. Elizabeth's words still echo through time:

Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! (Luke 1:42)

This passage is especially meaningful to the Mission Sisters, whose charism is rooted in hospitality, compassion, and empowering others, especially women and the young, to respond to God's call with courage and joy. Mary's visit to Elizabeth is a model of mutual support, faith in action, and the power of encounter.

That same spirit of encounter and unity was alive and well over the weekend as students, staff, managers, and coaches travelled to Napier to compete in the annual Mission Cup and Te Toa Cup. These tournaments, celebrating netball and hockey respectively, have been a cherished tradition since 1972, bringing together sister schools across Aotearoa. The wind blew, the sun shone, and we returned not only victorious, bringing home the Mission Cup, but also richer for the experience, having deepened our bonds with our fellow Mission Colleges. Although we were not equally victorious in Te Toa Cup we were proud of our third placing against worthy opposition.

Back home, we were honoured to host the regional Ngā Manu Kōrero speech competition. It was a true blessing to witness so many young people speak with such confidence, clarity, and mana. Events like these are vital. They nurture young leaders, give voice to diverse perspectives, and affirm the power of language and identity.

We are also excited to announce the official opening of our new Art Rooms and refurbished Science Laboratory on Friday, 6 June at 7.00am. These new spaces will inspire creativity, innovation, and discovery, further supporting our students to thrive in all areas of learning.

As we reflect on these moments, we are reminded of the strength found in connection, courage, and community. A fitting whakataukī that links beautifully to the Visitation and our shared mission is:

Ehara taku toa i te toa takitakhi. Engari, he toa takitini My strength is not the strength of one it is the strength of many

Just as Mary and Elizabeth supported one another, and just as our schools and communities uplift each other through sport, speech, and spirit, we journey forward—together.

Congratulations to architect and SHC alumni, Hannah Kelly, for her Mission House design winning in the Education section of the 2025 Wellington Architecture Awards. The judges' citation reads: "Mission House is an inspiring example of how sustainability and innovation can thrive within constraint. Working within the realities of a modest budget, the architects have delivered a high-performing, low-impact building that places student wellbeing at its heart. Every decision - from the use of mass timber construction to thermal modelling, natural ventilation, and carefully selected materials - reflects a commitment to performance without compromise. At its centre, an elevated library acts as a pataka of knowledge - a serene, light-filled space that brings calm, connection, and a sense of ceremony to the school day. 
