Nau mai, haere mai, e te whānau,

This week's Gospel from Luke has offered a profound challenge and insight. For a long time, I struggled to grasp the meaning of the parable about the rich man and the "eye of the needle". That changed when I saw an illustration showing a narrow gate in the city wall, known as the eye of the needle, through which camels could only pass if they were unloaded.

This image reframes the parable beautifully: it's not just about wealth, but about what we're willing to let go of in order to enter into deeper relationship with God. It is a reminder that material possessions mean little if we neglect our spiritual lives. We are called to live generously, humbly, and with purpose.

My grandmother, a humble and wise woman, often said, "You never go short of what you give others". Her words echo the heart of this Gospel. True richness is found not in what we keep, but in what we share. A whakataukī that speaks to this beautifully is:

Nāu te rourou, nāku te rourou, ka ora ai te iwi

With your food basket and my food basket, the people will thrive

This speaks to the power of collective generosity and shared responsibility. As a school community, may we continue to support one another, give freely, and grow together in spirit and kindness.

On Monday, I had the privilege of spending the day with our Kapa Haka rōpū at the regional competition. Our team placed first or second in 6 out of 8 categories. A phenomenal achievement. But what moved me most was a moment of quiet grace: when the two schools who qualified for Nationals were announced, our students stood, turned, and applauded them.

They had given everything to the campaign. And though they were hurting, they chose to honour others. As a Principal, I was deeply proud, not just of their performance, but of their character. That moment of humility and mana will stay with me for a long time.

Let us continue to walk together in faith, generosity, and aroha.


Hip Hop - Code Red
