PPTA Industrial Action Alert (YET TO BE CONFIRMED)

You will be aware of PPTA industrial action that is planned this term. The PPTA has advised the Sacred Heart College Board that its member teachers at our school may take partial strike action in Week 10 of Term 3. During those times, PPTA members will not teach, instruct or supervise students in certain year levels but continue to teach all other students.

If we get confirmation of this action officially, we will let you know.

The industrial action may involve rostering home of year levels as follows:

Week 10 Term 3

Monday 15 September – Years 12 and 13 Tuesday 16 September – Year 11 Wednesday 17 September – Year 10 Thursday 18 September – Year 9

If the partial strikes go ahead, it is important that you make alternative arrangements for the care of your student/s under 14 years of age on the day your student could be rostered home. If making alternative arrangements for care is difficult, we can still supervise a small number of students if required.
