#### **Attendance Matters**

Attendance continues to be both a **national priority** and a **school priority**. We ask families to please respect the school calendar and avoid booking holidays during term time. In Term 2, **5%** of our students travelled overseas, and in Term 3, this rose to **6%**. These absences have a significant impact on learning and progress. Every day at school counts.

#### **Uniform and Presentation Standards**

We appreciate your support in maintaining our school's expectations around uniform and personal presentation. A reminder that **facial piercings are not permitted**, this includes **nose and eyebrow piercings**. Students may wear a **maximum of two earrings per ear**. If students arrive at school with additional piercings, they will be asked to remove them. Sandals are part of our summer uniform; they are to be brown and have a back strap. These standards help reinforce a sense of pride and belonging, and we thank you for your continued support.
